The Ordinance, entitled an Ordinance to amend an Ordinance in regard to that certain section # 26, having been read at the regular meeting of Feb. 1st, and passed, was read for the second reading, and upon motion made and seconded to pass this reading, the vote did not carry, therefore this amendment does not hold.; the old Ordinance remaining in tact.

The Sanitary Ordinance read for the first time at the February meeting and passed, and tabled for the second reading, passed the second reading. That certain sec. #1, Article # 2, in regard to penalty shall be changed to read upon failure to comply with this Ordinance it shall be deemed a Breach of this Ordinance and a Breach of the Peace rather than a misdemeanor, and shall be punished accordingly.

A motion was made, seconded and passed to revise the lien in conjunction with the above Ordinance, and attach a Note to it.

The following Resolution was adopted as read in regards to Ft. King George.

A Resolution.

Whereas the site of Old Fort King George, just East of the City Limits is a most Historic spot, and the improvement of it as a Park would be of great benefit to the people of Darien in many ways, and

Whereas the City has already gone to some expense in the matter of survey and abstract, Therefore be it resolved by the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Darien in lawful meeting:

1. That the State Division of Parks be and it is hereby urged to acquire this area as soon as possible, and commence the improvement of same

2. That this body will give all future cooperation in the matter that it is possible to do

3. That a certified copy of these resolutions be mailed to said Division Of State Parks.

A motion was made, seconded and passed to return all money paid to the City of Darien as Slot machine money to the owner of such.

There being no further business, the meeting was duly adjourned.
