LAHS Meeting, May 19, 1994, 7:30 P.M.: The program will be "Invisible Americans: American Indians in Georgia" presented by Ervan G. Garrison, Assistant Professor, University of Georgia, Department of Anthropology. Professor Garrison has been made available to LAHS from the Franklin College Outreach Program of the University of Georgia. (Canceled)

Reading from "Early Days on the Georgia Tidewater", we are informed: "The Guale Indians came first. Evidence of their presence in the land that is now McIntosh County is plentiful and well-documented. The name "Guale" came to designate both the Georgia barrier islands and the coastal Creek Indians whose territory it was before the arrival of the Europeans."

The nomination of officers for LAHS, 1994-95, was reported by the Nominating Committee, Ken Akins, chairman, at the April meeting. The May meeting is the Annual Meeting. President Mattie Gladstone will give the report for 1993-94, after which the new officers will assume office.
