September 30, Oct. 1st, "Week-End on Sapele".

LARS Meeting, September 15, 1994, 7:30 P.M.: Buddy Sullivan, LARS vice-president and Manager of the Sapelo Island National Estuarine Research Reserve, will present the program for September 15th. His topic will be "Sapelo Island:Where We've Been and Where We're Going." This talk and slide program will feature the history of Sapelo Island as well as a look at the educational, research and resource stewardship efforts that are currently in place on the Sapelo Reserve, as well as plans for the future. The historical portion of the program will focus on the three primary eras of private ownership of Sapelo, Thomas Spalding, Howard E. Coffin and Richard J. Reynolds, Jr. Selected slides will depict scenes from the island's interesting 19th and 20th century past. Additional slides will focus on what is happening to sapelo now, including discussion of the new Interpretive Visitors Center planned for the Reserve, as well as the new Nature Trail and the educational and research programs in general. Buddy Sullivan has studiously researched the history of Sapelo Island and McIntosh County for the last ten years. His popular book *Early Days on the Georgia Tidewater*, now in its 3rd edition at 850 pages, is the only comprehensive history of McIntosh County available. It has been acknowledged as one of the most significant recent contributions to the literature of the Georgia coast. Sullivan's other published works include shorter volumes of history about Sapelo Island, McIntosh County and Darien, the Darien Presbyterian Church, the Darien Bank and the "lost town" of Williamsburg, Georgia.
