Jim Jordan returns as guest speaker with the remarkable story of "A Confederate's Revenge: Gazaway Lamar Defeats the Yankees." On December 20, 1964, Major General William Sherman's army marched unopposed into Savannah. He immediately proclaimed that residents who took an oath of allegiance to the Union could keep all their property, except slaves. Gazaway Lamar, one of the South's most influential businessmen, took the oath. Still, the U.S. government seized his cotton and threw him in jail without charges. Join us as Mr. Jordan presents the story of Lamar's fight for "justice."

Jim Jordan is an author, historian, and lecturer specializing in the history and architecture of the 19th century South. His first book, "Savannah Grey," a historical novel about life in Georgia during the thirty years leading up the Civil War, was nominated for the 2007 Michael Shaara Award for Excellence in Civil War fiction. His article about the illegal 1858 voyage of the slave ship *Wanderer* and the man who masterminded it appeared in the fall 2009 issue of the *Georgia Historical Quarterly*. He and his wife Kathleen live on Callawassie Island, S.C.

"Sherman's March Through Georgia" will be presented by Dr. Stephen Berry as part of the Darien sesquicentennial schedule of events commemorating the *Burning of Darien*, one of the most tragic and poignant events of the Civil War.

Dr. Berry received his M.A./Ph.D. in History from the University of North Carolina. He is currently employed at the University of Georgia as Associate Professor of History. He has been fascinated with history from age seven – his book "House of Abraham: Lincoln and the Todds, a Family Divided by War," has been praised as a masterful study of the Todd family. In addition to his books, he has authored several articles for magazines such as Civil War Monitor and North and South.

150th COMMEMORATIVE EVENTS, BURNING OF DARIEN

On June 11, 1863 the 54th Massachusetts was ordered to burn the small town of Darien, GA completely. Despite his own personal opposition to the orders given to him, Robert Gould Shaw led the 54th Mass. into Darien for the purpose of burning the town into ruins.
