LAHS Meeting, Thursday, May 15, 2014, 7:00 p.m. Fort King George Historic Site Dutch treat supper, 5:45 p.m. at B&J Steak

John A. Caramia, Jr., currently the Director of Interpretive Programs for the Coastal Heritage Society, will be presenting a program on *Georgia and the War of 1812*. 2014 marks the third year of the 200th Anniversary of the war little remembered or understood by Americans today. This presentation will look at the events of the War of 1812 through the eyes of Georgia, the preparations taken by the state to defend itself, the events of the war that were followed by Georgians, and the brief British occupation.

Mr. Caramia graduated from State University of New York College in anthropology with a minor in history, and did his doctoral work at UGA in Social Science Education. He has an extensive background in history, interpretive education and planning, staff training, and teaching from Colonial Williamsburg to State University of New York. He is currently the President of the Coastal Museum Association.

Michael Higgins' presentation will be "The Engagement Between CSS Alabama and USS Kearsage." On this date 150 years ago, USS Kearsarge sank the notorious Confederate commerce raider CSS Alabama after slightly over an hour's combat, roughly 4.5 miles off Cherbourg, France - there were more than 14,000 spectators. The Executive Officer of CSS Alabama was John McIntosh Kell, who was born and raised at Laurel Grove just outside Darien.

Mr. Higgins graduated from America's oldest Merchant Marine Academy, State University of New York Maritime College, Fort Schuyler, NY. He is co-founder of the Confederate Navy Historical Society. He has extensive experience in oceanographic research, port management, and advisor to the U.S. Dept. of State in defending the title to the USS *Alabama* wreck.

STEVEN SMITH LEAVES FORT KING GEORGE FOR NEW POSITION. On April 8th, members of LAHS took a field trip to the MASSIE HERITAGE CENTER in Savannah. This wonderful old building was given to Savannah in the mid-1850s as a school for children who could not afford the private schools of the day. It afforded many children a superior education for almost a hundred years. Now it is owned by the School System of Savannah and is used for various historical exhibits including the original city squares as designed for the construction of Savannah, the history of the Indian heritage of Georgia, a real life 1850s classroom, and a marvelous display of all the architecture to be found in the period homes of Savannah thru the ages. STEVEN SMITH is the head honcho at the Massie Institute now and he gave us the grand tour. In the few weeks he has been there he has certainly mastered things well, as you would never have known he was new at the job. We enjoyed the afternoon with him and though we will miss his being with us in Darien, we wish him much success in his new endeavor and want him to know how much we appreciate his work with us at the Fort for the last decade.
