Peter Mullen (*"Civil War Medicine: Infectious Disease & Immunity"*) returns with a fascinating dialogue written and presented in "living history" format in the persona of Pvt. R. M. Heater, reflecting 19th century period attire and language. *"Memoirs from the Bluegrass"* is based on Pvt. Heater's memoirs of living on a farm near Pleasant Hill, Kentucky and how he became a Confederate Soldier during the turbulent times of the Civil War.

Mr. Mullen is a native born Kentuckian and a graduate of the University of Louisville and Western Kentucky University earning degrees in Bachelor of Arts and Master of Science and currently living in Callahan, FL where he is professor at Florida State College at Jacksonville. He is a member of the Speakers Bureau for the Georgia Historical Society, Sons of Confederate Veterans, Michigan Veterans of the Civil War, Anthropological Multicultural Association of the South, and Florida State College. He lectures to professional and historical societies nationwide in observance of the Sesquicentennial Commemoration of the Civil War. Professor Mullen was commissioned by Gov. Steven LO. Beshear of the Commonwealth of Kentucky as a *Kentucky Colonel* on September 20, 2011 in the 220th year of the Commonwealth.

"Flags Over Revolutionary Georgia" will be presented by Bill Ramsaur (*"War in Liberty County"*). He will display and describe ten flags that flew over Revolutionary Georgia, along with key historical personalities and events associated with each flag. The Grand Union flag (illustrated here) was created to celebrate General George Washington's newly established Continental Army. This flag, also known as the Continental Colors, because it represented the entire nation, was never officially sanctioned by the Continental Congress, but was recognized as the American national flag between 1775 and 1777.

As part of a Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution committee, Bill helped to identify and document Georgia's Revolutionary War Trail. He served as editor of the series of nine historical brochures that describe major Revolutionary War battles along the Savannah River and Coastal Georgia. Bill resides on St. Simons Island with his wife, Gloria, and is a member of the Lower Altamaha Historical Society.

This day in history (to coincide with meeting dates)

November 21, 1860 – Following the Nov. 6 election of Abraham Lincoln as President, Gov. Joseph E. Brown signed an act calling for a secession convention in Georgia. According to the legislation, on the first Wednesday in January 1861, elections would be held throughout the state to elect delegates to the convention, which would convene in Milledgeville on Jan. 16. 1861.

December 5, 1864 - In his memoirs, Gen. Sherman recalled that things went well as his force began the final leg of its March to the Sea. "On the 5th of December I reached Ogeechee Church about 50 miles from Savannah, and found there fresh earthworks, which had been thrown up by McLaw's Division, but he must have seen that both his flanks were being turned and prudently retreated to Savannah without a fight. All the columns then pursued leisurely their march toward Savannah, corn and forage becoming more and more scarce, but rice fields beginning to occur along the Savannah and Ogeechee Rivers, which provided a good substitute, both as food and forage. The weather was fine, the roads good, and everything seemed to favor me."

January 16, 1862 - From Savannah, J. H. Graham wrote to his wife in Coweta County about camp life early in the Civil War: "I have been here twelve days, and it seems that I have been away from home nearly twelve weeks. You have no idea how much I want to see you and the children, to be at home once more. 'Home Sweet Home.' There is no place like home"
