Al Sandrik, Warning Coordination Meteorologist with the National Weather Service, Weather Forecast Office in Jacksonville, Florida, will discuss Georgia's hurricane history with an emphasis on several major 19th century storms.

Mr. Sandrik has a BS Degree in Meteorology from Florida State University. He was employed by the National Hurricane Center from 1991-1994 and worked in the Center during Hurricane Andrew in 1992. He was a member of the National Weather Service Forecast Office Jacksonville "Spin up" staff in 1995 and advanced in this office to become the Warning Coordination Meteorologist in 2002. Prior to joining the National Weather Service, he served as a Meteorologist and Oceanographer in the Navy where he was attached to USS Iwo Jima (LPH-2), the 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit (Beirut 1983), and at Naval Air Station Cecil Field.

(Georgia Historical Markers) **Rice Hope** is located on U.S. 17 2 miles north of Eulonia. "Famous Rice and Indigo Plantation of Colonial and Revolutionary times, Rice Hope was the home of George McIntosh, son of John McIntosh Mor of Darien, and brother of General Lachlan McIntosh. George McIntosh was Official Surveyor for St. Andrew's Parish, Member of the Commons House of Assembly, Member of the First Provincial Congress of Georgia, Member of the Council of Safety. During the Revolution, the home of George McIntosh at Rice Hope was burned and his slaves and stock run off by the British."

Old Courthouse at Sapelo Bridge is located on U.S. 17 0.8 mile north of Eulonia. "Sapelo Bridge, on the old Savannah to Darien Road 200 yards east of this spot, was the seat of McIntosh County from 1793 to 1818. Here the Courthouse and other public buildings stood; here, too, were the Armory and Muster Ground for the McIntosh County Cavalry Troop, and here the Stage Coaches stopped to refresh the passengers and change horses."
