Ed Cawthon, one of our LAHS members, will present this month's program on "Affair at South Newport." Join us as Ed shares this fascinating story of an attack by Federal troops on the Confederate post on the McIntosh County coast in August 1864.

Ed was raised in Brunswick, GA and graduated from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy in 1962. He sailed on United Fruit Ships as Third Mate, USNR, for 10 years. He worked ashore in the maritime industry for 36 years in various ports – from Port of New York to Liverpool, England to Oakland, CA to Savannah, GA. He has had a lifelong passion for history, especially local and family history. He is introduced these days as the father of Dr. Lara Bailey of Pine Harbor, McIntosh County.

She holds an MFA from the University of Montana, and in 2007 was awarded an honorary doctorate from Unity College in Maine.

'THIS DAY IN GEORGIA HISTORY" (to coincide with LAHS Meeting Dates)

November 17, 1864: This marked day three of the *MARCH TO THE SEA* for three of the four columns (Sherman and the 14th Corps started a day later). One of the important assignments was to destroy railroad tracks in their paths.

December 8, 1735: James Oglethorpe sailed for Georgia from the port of Cowes on the Isle of Wight off the southern coast of England.

January 19, 1871: Savannah became the first city in America to celebrate Robert E. Lee's birthday as a public holiday. Lee had a special relationship with Savannah, as this had been his first assignment following graduation from West Point in 1829.
