LAHS members Ed and Joan Meyer will discuss and show images of their interesting trip earlier this year to Russia, Finland and Norway. Ed will describe the difficult and often tedious preparation required to travel in Russia, a photographic exploration and brief history of the city of St. Petersburg, as well as impressions of life in the second largest city in Russia. He will then show what life is like north of the Arctic Circle by Lapland and the Sami people and their connection to the land and reindeer. The Meyers then boarded a ship on the Arctic Ocean and toured the Norwegian Fjords while visiting their former and present capital cities.

News from the Board:

- Sissy Kammer has been elected by the Board as the new LAHS Archives committee chairperson and coordinator, replacing Linda Daniels. Thank you, Linda, for a job well done. Sissy has spent numerous hours in recent weeks cataloging and organizing the materials, documents and books in the Archives. Paul Nix and Wes Tippins installed gutters on the building to prevent water intrusion into the front entrance and to channel water into the rain barrel that Kaye Traer donated. The water is badly needed to maintain the plants and shrubs around the building. Thanks also to Sissy and Terry Kammer for putting in additional plants. We are seeking volunteers to staff the Archives for several hours on the third Thursday of each month. Those interested may sign up on the list with Sissy Kammer at any monthly meeting.
- Thanks and gratitude are expressed on behalf of the Society to Ed Meyer for the generous donation of a collection of historical books for the Archives; to Chuck Bryan for donating a collection of past issues of scholarly journals; and to Dan Good for several donations in the last year of state and area historic maps. All of these materials make outstanding additions to our growing research collection at the LAHS Archives.
- LAHS made its annual contribution in October of \$500.00 to the Friends of Fort King George in recognition of the ongoing support and facilities use provided the Society by Valarie Ikhwan and her staff at the Fort.

Spring Field Trip to Ossabaw Island: Thursday, March 8, 2018, total cost \$70.00 per person. Cost includes (1) Round trip boat transportation to the island and (2) An Interpretive (walking) tour of the North End of the island by Ossabaw Foundation personnel, including their recent tabby slave cabin restoration project. (3) Participants will bring their own lunches and drinks – the island clubhouse will be the venue for lunch. After lunch, you'll have free time to explore on your own the marshlands and upland forest paths or relax in rocking chairs on the porch of the Club House with a view of Ossabaw Sound. (4) For those interested in touring the Torrey-West mansion after lunch, there is an

additional fee of \$15 and a two-hour round trip walk. A pontoon boat trip for the group of up to about 32 participants will leave from Skidaway Island to Ossabaw. The trip will include an interpretive ecological tour by the boat captain. The boat will depart Skidaway Island dock at around 9:00 am and arrive back at the dock at 3:45. The dock is approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes from Darien. Mobility: The Foundation does not recommend this walking-only trip for people with mobility concerns. Mobility needs include steep ramps at the docks and walking for four stretches of ¼ -1/3 mile each. The walks are flat and on dirt roads or grass.
