In recognition of Black History Month, Dr. William H. A. "Bill" Collins will review the contributions of Blacks in the medical profession, emphasizing doctors and other local medical practitioners.

Dr. Collins has family roots and connections in Harris Neck, Darien, Brunswick, Kings Bay and Woodbine, Georgia – intertwined with those in Nassauville, Jacksonville, Fernandina Beach and St. Petersburg, Florida. He is an able representative of the Gullah Geechee Corridor and culture of the coastal areas of Georgia and Florida, and shares his talents with people across the region and the nation. He has accumulated an array of credentials including – but not limited to – pharmacist, educator, counselor, certified choir director, minister of music, organist, consultant, entrepreneur, family genealogist, and more.

"Water To My Soul: The Story of Eliza Lucas Pinckney" will be presented by Pamela Bauer Mueller. This is Ms. Mueller's newest historical novel, and weaves a captivating tale about Eliza Lucas Pinckney's fight to bring wealth to the south through the production of indigo as a cash crop shortly before the American Revolution. Her remarkable success in the 18th century colonial world is a noteworthy achievement that required skill, luck and a strong personality. The fact that she did this while working within the enormous constraints faced by women makes her even more remarkable.

Pamela Bauer Mueller is a national award-winning author who resides on Jekyll Island with her husband Michael and two cats. She was raised in Oregon and worked as a flight attendant for Pan American Airlines before moving to Mexico City. There she taught English, modeled and acted for 18 years. After returning to the United States, she worked for 12 years as a U.S. Customs Inspector. She took an early retirement to become a full-time author.

FIELD TRIP: For the last 22 years, Dr. John Derden, Professor Emeritus of History at East Georgia College, has conducted a tour of SHERMAN'S MARCH sites in his area of the state. This trip is coming up on Saturday, February 25th. This is a full day tour, beginning at 9 a.m. with pre-trip orientation in Room B 112 of the Student Services Complex at East Central College in Swainsboro. Dr. Derden will narrate the trip, telling local anecdotes, pointing out significant Union and Confederate campsites, Big Buckhead Church, and this year the Confederate military prison, Camp Lawton, which has been in the news lately because of recent archeological findings. Dr. Derden's trip includes all transportation and lunch for \$70.00 per person. A few members of LAHS have indicated an interest in this trip. We would have to leave Eulonia at 7 a.m. in order to be in Swainsboro on time. The trip ends at 6 p.m., and we would

"THIS DAY IN GEORGIA HISTORY" (to coincide with LAHS meeting dates)

February 16, 1736 Around 7 p.m., James Oglethorpe and a small group left Savannah aboard a 10-oar boat for St. Simons Island. At around 11 p.m., they landed on Skidaway Island, where they ate a meal and then slept on the ground in their clothes with only a single blanket for warmth.

March 15, 1858 Clergyman and author Edward R. Carter was born in Athens, GA. He was an African-American minister who became pastor of Atlanta's First Baptist Church in 1882. At the time, the church was \$3,000 in debt, but under Carter, the debt was erased and the church ended up with \$10,000 in assets. The money was put to good use, as Carter was influential in the founding of Spelman College.

April 19, 1865 Returning to her home in Washington, GA, 24-year-old Eliza Frances Andrews wrote in her journal from Milledgeville of the previous day's events, including a brief meeting with one of Georgia's most famous poets: . . "They began to evacuate the city (Macon) at dusk yesterday, and all through the night we could hear the tramp of men and horses, mingled with the rattle of artillery and baggage wagons . . .We were up almost by daylight, and even then found others starting to the depot ahead of us . . . We reached the depot at least an hour before the schedule time. . . Sidney Lanier was there, trying to get aboard one of the outgoing trains . . . The poor fellow is just up from a spell of typhoid fever, and looked as thin and white as a ghost. . . When the Central train backed up, there was such a rush to get aboard that I thought we would have the life squeezed out of us. I saw one man knock a woman down and run right over her. I hope the Yankees will catch him . . *Source: Eliza Frances Andrews, <u>The War-Time Journal of a Georgia Girl: 1864-1865</u> (New York: D. Appleton and Co., 1908), pp. 155-159.*
