LAHS Meeting, Thursday, February 16, 7:00 p.m. Fort King George Historic Site Dutch treat supper, 5:45 p.m. at B&J Steak

Author Janisse Ray will present a program titled "If Old Trees Could Talk: What I Learned at the Archives," about her historical research in neighboring Tattnall County. Tattnall was formed in 1801 from Montgomery County and never suffered the loss of its courthouse. Thus, the Tattnall County Archives contains records that date back to 1802. Janisse will take us on a virtual tour of the Archives and talk about some of the amazing history that is revealed in old books, court documents, and loose records.

Janisse Ray has written five books of literary nonfiction and a book of eco-poetry. Much of her work deals with environmental issues in the South; she has been called the South's best ecology writer. She is a lover of regional history and local culture, as well as an amateur genealogist. She is the volunteer archivist for Tattnall County Archives, located in Reidsville.

Historian, Artist, Architect: those talents are all embodied to a very high level in James H. (Jim) Klippel of Atlanta who will be our featured speaker in March. Jim's topic will be the renowned architect Frank Lloyd Wright and South Carolina's Auldbrass Plantation -- to which he brings a special knowledge and insight based on his research of many years. Auldbrass Plantation showcases the architectural genius of Frank Lloyd Wright and is located on the Combahee River in Beaufort County. Built in 1939, it is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Wright designed Auldbrass to exist in harmony with the Lowcountry landscape of which it is a part.

With over 30 years of design and building experience, Jim Klippel's architectural firm specializes in unique residential home designs. Last year, he won first place in the ARDA national design competition for his rustic passive solar home built of native woods, stone and glass. He is a professional member of the AIBD and the Georgia Green Building Council, as well as an NCBDC certified building designer. In 2006 Jim

was awarded "Design Member of the Year" by the Georgia chapter of the AIBD. Jim is also a talented artist, and his unique abstract paintings of wildlife, sea life and landscapes have been highly acclaimed for many years.

Christy Sherman, Director of the Richmond Hill Convention and Visitor's Bureau, will be our April speaker. She will discuss the unique 20th century historical heritage of Richmond Hill and lower Bryan County, particularly as it relates to the influence of famous automaker Henry Ford who made Richmond Hill his winter home from 1925 to 1947. Christy will also talk about heritage tourism in Richmond Hill and along the Georgia coast, and some of the ongoing restoration and preservation in initiatives in lower Bryan County.

Christy Sherman has served as the Director of Tourism for the Richmond Hill Convention and Visitors Bureau since 2014. Prior to her current position, she worked for four years at the Visitors Center at Fort McAllister State Historic Park. She is serving her second term as president of the Richmond Hill Historical Society and has served on their board of directors since 2009. Through her work at these organizations, she promotes tourism using historical and natural assets in Richmond Hill. In addition, Christy is also the vice-president of the Georgia Coast Travel Association where she helps promote tourism for the coastal region. Her proudest accomplishment in tourism and historic education is the creation of the Coastal Bryan Heritage Trail, a driving tour and educational app and companion booklet which marks 30 historic sites in Richmond Hill.
