February is Black History Month. In recognition of that, our speaker will be Wilson D. Moran. Mr. Moran is a resident of Harris Neck, a member and deacon of the First African Baptist Church in McIntosh County, and an icon of his community. His presentation is entitled Sierra Leone – The Language We Cry In, the story of how he traced his roots back to a village in Africa by following a "song" that his

mother had taught him and his siblings as small children, a song passed down through generations of the family. In 1997 Wilson Moran and Joseph Apala helped organized a family trip which led them to West Africa and ultimately to a small village in Sierra Leone called Sanahungola. There they met a woman who knew the exact same song Mary Moran had taught her children, and they also encountered others who shared their skills and knowledge. Come hear Mr. Moran elaborate on how he found his heritage -- through a song that led him back through hundreds of years to his roots.



Tresidents Day

President's Day, *February 18, 2019*, honors and celebrates the life and achievements of George Washington, the first President of the United States (1789-1797). It was created in 1879, first celebrated the following year. In 1971 this was changed to the third Monday in February. It was the first federal holiday created in honor of an American citizen.

The World War II Home Front Museum: Coastal Georgia at War opened in December 2018 on St. Simons Island and is the only museum dedicated to the World War II Home Front story from a local community's perspective. Museum Site Manager Kim Campbell will discuss the creation of the museum, its mission, and what guests can expect when they come to visit. Ms. Campbell holds a Masters Degree in public history with a concentration in historic preservation, as well as a bachelors degree in history from Mercer University in Macon. She is a published researcher, most recently in the National Council on Public History's essay collection *Preserving Place* and in the *South Carolina Historical Quarterly*.

Black History Month: The celebration of Black History Month began as "Negro History Week," which was created in 1926 by Carter G. Woodson, a noted African American historian, scholar, educator, and publisher. It honors the contributions of African Americans to US history, such as John Mercer Langston, the first black man to become a lawyer when he passed the bar in Ohio in 1854; George Washington Carver, who developed 300 derivative products from peanuts; and Thurgood Marshall, the first African American appointed to the US Supreme Court. It became a month-long celebration in 1976; the month of February was chosen to coincide with the birthdays of Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln.
