Our presenter tonight, Mark Yeager, is a retired architect, resident of Harris Neck, and holds a lifetime membership in both the Lower Altamaha Historical Society and the Friends of the Savannah Coastal Wildlife Refuge. His interest in Harris Neck began ten years ago and has led him to extraordinary researcher Jim McMahon, also retired, an LAHS member and resident of Belvedere. Their teamwork has taken them to libraries, archives and county courthouses across Georgia, ferreting out little-known details of Harris Neck's controversial and only partly understood history. The presentation tonight will discuss the role that early development of aviation played on Harris Neck, the two airfields that once existed on the north end of it, and the whole country, and the time leading up to the outbreak of World War II and the resulting upheaval locally and across the nation. This talk is planned as the first of a three-part series that spans the period from the Civil War to the present day.

This day in Georgia history

- November 21, 1733 In response to an 8/12/1733 letter from James Oglethorpe stating that rum drinking was responsible for much of the sickness and death in Georgia, the colony's trustees voted to prohibit the drinking of rum in /Georgia and directed that all barrels or other containers of rum brought into the colony should be destroyed.
- December 4, 1847 Atlanta pioneer Jonathan Norcross made a presentation to an Atlanta town meeting that an effort be launched to encourage the General Assembly to move the state capital from Milledgeville to Atlanta.
- *January* 16, 1920 Georgia went dry as the 18th amendment to the U.S. Constitution mandating national prohibition went into effect.
