LAHS members Chris Milner and Buddy Sullivan will present a program about timber rafting on the Altamaha River in the late 1800s and early 1900s. Buddy will give a short talk to place Darien's timber industry in historical context; then Chris will show a video program filmed 40 years ago, "THE LAST RAFT," about rafting days on the river. John Crawford, an actual participant on the Last Raft project, will join them with his commentary. Also included will be clips from an interview with the late author Brainard Cheney who wrote historical novels about the lumber days in southeast Georgia.

Our program, postponed from last October, is presented by Dr. Michael P. Morris. His lecture will center on the Southeastern Indians as they relate to Georgia – such as Indian removal, the Scots-Irish fur traders who took Indian mates in the Colonial period, and their adaptation to the southern backcountry.

Dr. Morris has a Master of Arts degree from Georgia Southern University and a Doctor of Philosophy degree from Auburn University. His research specialties are Early America to 1876 and Native American Culture. He has taught History at several state colleges and is currently an Assistant Professor at the College of Coastal Georgia.

LAHS ARCHIVES WILL BE CLOSED FROM THANKSGIVING DAY THROUGH NEW YEAR'S DAY

This Day in Georgia History:

November 19, 1864: From Richmond, Georgia's Delegate to the Confederate Congress sent a telegraph to the people of Georgia indicating that they had met with Confederate president Jefferson Davis ...about Sherman's March to the Sea. The message exhorted the people of Georgia: "Let every man fly to arms! burn what you cannot carry. Burn all bridges and block up the roads in his route. Assail the invader in front, flank, and rear, by night and by day. Let him have no rest."

December 3, 1832: Nine Counties Created: Gov. Wilson signed legislation creating Forsyth, Lumpkin, Union, Cobb, Gilmer, Murray, Cass (later Bartow)), Floyd, and Paulding counties. All were created from Cherokee County which consisted of all lands in Georgia then occupied by the Cherokee Nation. The new counties were only "paper counties" until the Cherokees were removed by force in 1838. Forsyth County was named for John Forsyth, former state attorney general and U.S. secretary of state under presidents Andrew Jackson and Martin Van Buren. Lumpkin County was named for GA governor Wilson Lumpkin who was in office at the county's creation. Union County was named in recognition of the federal union. Cobb County was named for U.S. congressman and state superior court judge Thomas W. Cobb. Tradition holds that Cobb's wife, Marietta, was also honored when the legislators named the county seat. Gilmer County was named for two-time governor George R. Gilmer, governor at the time of the Cherokee's forced removal to the west. Murray County was named for attorney and speaker of the GA House of Representatives Thomas W. Murray. Cass County was named for Gen. Lewis Cass of Michigan. Because of Cass's support for abolition and the Union, the General Assembly renamed the county in December 1861 in honor of GA Confederate Gen. Francis Bartow who died at the Battle of First Manassas. Floyd County was named for Gen. John Floyd who was involved in various campaigns against the Creek Indians. Paulding County was named in honor of Revolutionary War hero John Paulding.

January 21, 1733: James Oglethorpe and a small party of Carolina rangers departed in a small boat from Beaufort, sailing southward along the inland coastal waterway. Their destination was the mouth of the Savannah River, at which point they would sail upriver looking for a site for the Georgia colony's first settlement.
