LAHS Meeting, Thursday, November 17, 2016, 7:00 p.m. Fort King George Historic Site Dutch treat supper, 5:45 p.m. at B&J Steak

Sandy Jensen will discuss the restoration of the historic Coast Guard Station on East Beach at St. Simons by the Coastal Georgia Historical Society. The new museum will feature an exhibition on the history of the Golden Isles during World War II providing a new look into how Georgia's coastal communities were on America's front line, enduring U-Boat attacks and serving as a platform for military and civil defense training. An important component of this initiative will be interpretation of the Brunswick shipyards where 99 Liberty ships were constructed by civilians.

Sandy is the Education Director for the CGHS and has a degree in history from Vanderbilt University and a Masters in Museum Studies from George Washington University. Her interest in museums and history has led her to work at Stratford Hall and Gunston Hall in Virginia, the National Building Museum in Washington D.C., the Flagler Museum in Palm Beach, and currently the St. Simons Lighthouse Museum. In Sandy's work for CGHS, she is responsible for training and scheduling volunteers and docents, leading youth tours and programs, and assisting in expanding the Society's program offerings for all ages.

Ashby Nix Worley, Satilla Riverkeeper, will speak about the ecological importance of the Satilla River, and its value to the communities that live there. Ashby was named the Satilla Riverkeeper in 2013 and has been busy with her duties to protect, restore and educate about the Satilla River ever since. As the Satilla Riverkeeper, Ashby works with the board of directors, Satilla Riverkeeper members and volunteers from across the 4,000-square mile watershed to protect and restore the habitat and flow of the Satilla River from its headwaters to the Atlanta Ocean, a distance of some 235 miles. The dark water Satilla has been increasingly threatened by agricultural runoff, septic tanks within the flood plain, destruction of adjacent wetland and increased mercury levels. The organization serves as the eyes and ears of the watershed and is the first responder when something is wrong.

While a student, Ashby worked as an intern with the Department of Natural Resources for the UGA Marine Extension Service, conducting coastal water quality monitoring and oyster reef restoration. She received her Master's Degree in order to take a job as a technician at the UGA Marine Institute on Sapelo Island, a post she was in before becoming the Satilla Riverkeeper. Ashby holds degrees in environmental science and biology from Mercer University where she graduated Cum Laude in 2006, as well as a Master of Environmental Science from Louisiana State University, with concentration on wetland studies.
